Students will learn the proportion of the various multi armed peaceful, semi-wrathful and wrathful images in different positions. They will also learn to compose various decorative motifs and elements used in the background of images, for instance, Pravamandala, Aura along with Toran.

Course Objective

Students will learn to draw full body such as Ganesh (with Petal and flame aura), Amoghapasa Lokesvara (with Petal and Flame aura), Megh sambhara (with Petal, aasan and toran) and Chakrasambhara (with Petal and Flame aura). They are expected to be capable of drawing the full body of two armed or multi armed peaceful, semi-wrathful and wrathful Buddhist images of their own style after this course.
